I will be posting some of the statements....which old age is great..we all don't remember.what happened just an hour ago.. so who do you think did this...



RIDE DEFENSIVELY...

Nearly two-thirds of all motorcycle accidents are caused by a driver violating a rider's right-of-way. Usually this is because the <u>motorcyclists was not seen</u>. To avoid this, YOU MUST RIDE AS IF NO ONE ELSE ON THE ROAD CAN

SEE

YOU!

Helpful tips to remember:

- *Slow down at intersections and ride through carefully.
- *Watch for turning vehicles.
- *Stay out of driver's blind spots especially Big Rigs and try not to stay next to them in case they have a tire blow-out.
 - *Signal well in advance of any change in your driving pattern.
 - *Don't assume a driver sees you, even if eye contact is made.
- *Use your horn when necessary or if you aren't sure a driver can see where you are. When doing so, honk twice, not once. Two beeps is far less annoying than one.

*RIDE PROUD... DRESS LOUD

Be careful when you approach another vehicle. It's hard for drivers in oncoming vehicles to accurately judge how fast your motorcycle is moving. That's why it's up to you to make sure you can react safely if another driver suddenly turns or pulls out in front of you. Also, make sure you have plenty of space between you and the vehicles in front of you.






