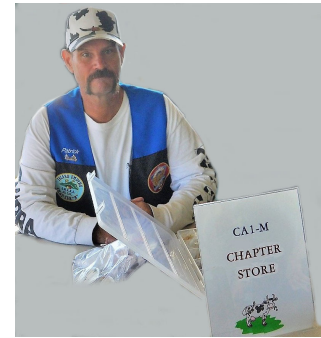

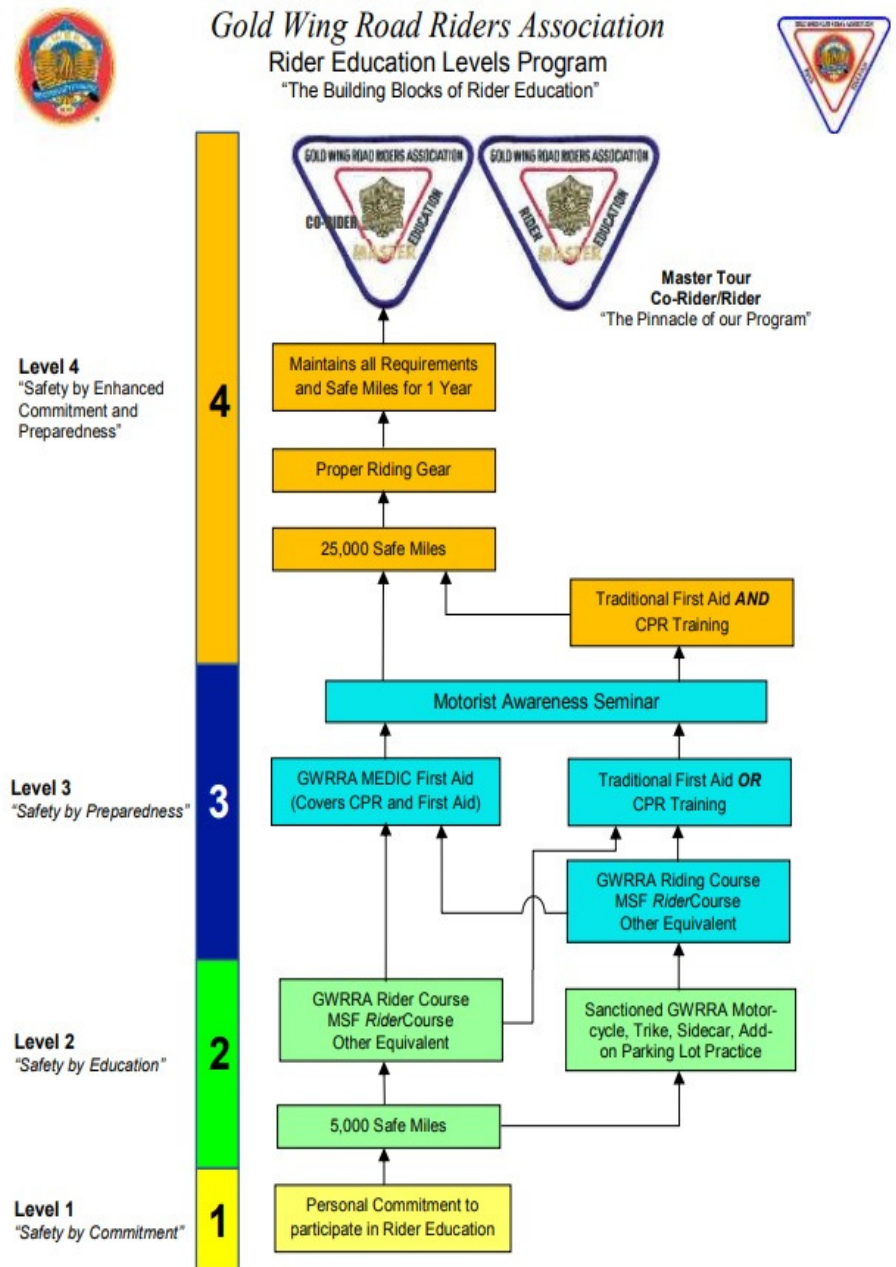

In 1946, Pioneertown was founded by a group of Hollywood investors, including actors Roy Rogers and Gene Autry. They dreamed of creating an Old West set 125 miles east of Los Angeles that was actually a town worth visiting, with 1880s-style false-front facades but interiors that had stuff for visitors to see and do too. Up went (from the outside) frontier stables, saloons, and jails; inside, they housed ice cream parlors, bowling alleys, and motels. It wasn't a place just for tourists to enjoy though; more than 50 films and television shows were filmed here in the 1940s and '50s.

While location shoots here have dwindled in the years since, you can still see mock gun-fights on Mane Street. But the most happening place by far is **Pappy and Harriet's Pioneertown Palace**, which hosts surprisingly big-name live acts—Robert Plant and Leon Russell have played here, and more contemporary bands like Iron & Wine and CHVRCHES pass through as well. This must-see desert find also **serves up awesome ribs, plus classic Santa Maria barbecue, burgers, sandwiches, and salads.**

Fool's Gear Cool Gear

HEAD. Considered precious by sensible people, never exposed by the pros. When fully in view, allows immediate identification of unsafe person not using his or hers. Hand out rider education info on sight.

HELMET. Most important piece of protective gear a rider can use. Protects against head injury, windblast, cold, and flying objects. Full-face helmet recommended.

EYES, EARS AND FACE. Exposure leads to irritated eyes, noise-deafening windblast, and distracting impacts from bugs and road debris.

FACESHIELD. "Saves face." Any rider who's been hit in the face by stones, insects, or debris can tell you the benefits.

HANDS. As nature! (not for long). Known to lock into curled position when exposed to cold, not genetically evolved to withstand abrasion.

GLOVES. Keep hands comfortable, functional, and protected. There's an infinite variety for all seasons.

BARE LIMBS. A phenomenon seen only in riders who think it's other people who crash. Subject to ridicule in riding circles.

JACKET AND PANTS. Long sleeves and sturdy trousers resist abrasion and protect against sunburn, dehydration, or hypothermia. Some riders wear padded gear with "body armor" for more protection. Light colors in the daytime and reflectivity at night make it easier for car drivers to see you.

FLIP FLOPS. Terminology for what sandals, toes and feet do upon contact with road surfaces, shift lever, brake pedal, or footrests.

BOOTS. Provide protection against foot and ankle injuries and give you a good grip on footrests or road surfaces.

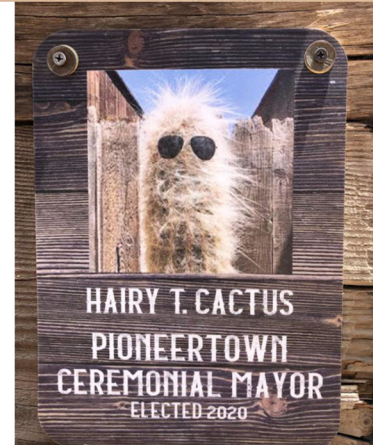
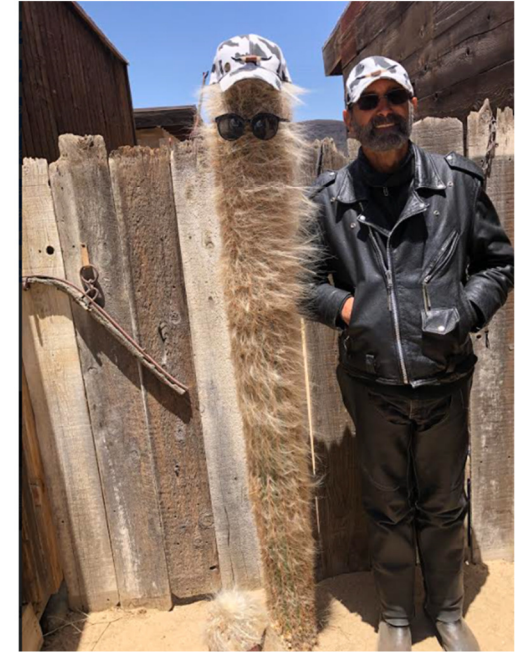

The District Rally starts early on Friday August 20 at the Wyndam Hotel and ends at noon on the Sunday August 22. The opportunities to enjoy a great weekend are everywhere! There are many structured activities sponsored by District, and there are wonderful riding opportunities in the local mountains. If you have the time, you should seriously consider sharing the event with all the GWRRA friends throughout the State. Check the Rally brochure for all the details – **Party Time.**

To make the weekend journey even more **enjoyable**, I have planned a spectacular back road ride to Visalia! You can certainly get to Visalia via the freeway in about 4 hours (yeah – a really fun 240 miles/not) or you can join me and take the scenic route! We will depart from **Location #1 at 8 AM** and start out on Hwy 15 / heading towards Hwy 395 and better roads (Butler Motorcycle Maps don't lie).

The **Sherman Pass** is a great way to get over the mountains - it is J41 just North of Pearsonville (140 miles); the pass is one of the most varied & scenic in the Sierras. The M99, more FUN, will take us over to the **Western Divide Hwy** (M190 = 220 miles) for a great ride in the **Sequoia National Monument** North to J37 and into Visalia (310 miles to the Wyndam hotel). The ride time will be about 8-9 hours including comfort stops and a lunch stop = more smiles per mile than the freeway! We will be there in time for Happy Hour!

Thanks to Sena technologies I found a way. Yet it may not be for all. However, with this set up using the Sena 20s Evo and above you can use bluetooth communication up to nine riders, listen to your music, gps and being able to hear and speak via CB radio.

For Honda Goldwings 2018 plus, you have to be ok not using the Apple CarPlay. Unfortunately Apple CarPlay interferes with the CB radio.

You must be willing to have the Sena unit attached to your helmets with inside speakers and microphone.

Also there are 3 other components that you will have to buy to be able to have this set up.
