




With great expectations we move into 2022 / it has to be better than 2020 & 2021!

The Good / the Bad / and the Ugly of the past year for me personally:

The good: great friendship and wonderful riding – great **FUN** at rallies & nice lunches on **spectacular rides** / the weather was typically outstanding during the drought, and we took advantage of that! Typically, the chapter had at least 2 rides per month, with additional shared rides with other chapters & retired riders of various chapters. 1M Chapter members stepped up to share & lead their favorite rides with the members – Thank You! I traded up from my 2012 Wing to the **DCT Tour**! A **spark** of new **enthusiasm** for riding!

The bad: Constant changing pandemic issues with ongoing fear & frustration. The continuing "**aging**" of our members & friends resulting in fewer physical opportunities for riding for some members; the lack of enthusiasm for motorcycle riding by the upcoming generations resulting in **fewer new members**. The past in GWRRA looked like more FUN than the future – we need to change that.

The Ugly: 10 days prior to my wife's scheduled knee replacement, Georgina fell and broke her pelvis on Halloween Eve, plus cracked her right hip socket and fractured the right sacral ala / meaning 2-3 months of no weight on her right leg: 5 days in the hospital for blood clots in the lungs, and 20 days in skilled rehab to gain the ability to get out of bed into a wheelchair on her own, prior to returning home. This is the month she should regain the ability to walk again! I gain the freedom to ride again, at least until her rescheduled knee replacement in March (she gets priority!). 2022: Time to focus on what makes this organization great: Friends / Fun / Safety / Knowledge

History is there to learn from – let's move forward with great friends and enjoy the rides & social activities in GWRRA! It takes all members to contribute to activities to **create the FUN** – what is your favorite after meeting ride (AMR) / be ready to share at an upcoming meeting. 
