I drove the DCT in which I thought was great. Now all I have to do is win the lotto so I could get one.



Do not ride next to cars or trucks in other lanes if you do not have to. You may be in the blind spot of the vehicle, which could switch lanes (into yours!) without warning. Vehicles in the next lane may also block your escape if you come upon danger in your own lane. Speed up or drop back to find lane space that is clear of traffic on both sides.



5 points for the first visit to that Visited Chapter's gathering


- 1 point for each additional visit to that same Visited Chapter's gathering




