Riding the 2018 GOLDWING by Ron Hogle

I can't believe that since I bought my first Goldwing in 1989, which was a 1984 GL1200 Interstate, I now have close to 275,000 miles on Goldwings.



The difference between the GL1200 and GL1500 was amazing. Then came the GL1800, which was even more amazing. Now there is the 3^{rd} Generation GL1800 Goldwing and Goldwing Tour, and believe me, they are even more amazing if that is possible! I have never felt a bike ride like this in all my 50 years of riding motor-cycles, it is just amazing.

When I throw my leg over the bike and straighten the bike up, I noticed it is a lot lighter and easier to get off the side stand. Then, while sitting on the bike, I can fold my arms and move the bike from side to side without the fear that this big bike is going to fall over, it is that noticeably smaller and lighter. Being smaller and lighter, really shows its stuff on mountains roads. It takes no effort to lean this bike over and fly through a turn, and I have noticed that I have more confidence while making slow speed turns as well as leaning through curves because the bike is so easy to ride.

It didn't take long to realize that with the new front suspension, all the small bumps I used to feel in the handlebars were gone. As I watched the tie rods bouncing up and down, there was no feeling of the road bumps coming through, this is just amazing at how smooth the bike rides.

The DCT transmission is very smooth while accelerating. It is not a very quiet automatic transmission but it works very well. The Auto/manual transmission is great for twisties, to help you keep the rpms up and give you plenty of power. The bike now gets about 20% better mileage and that will easily allow you to drive the same distance on less gas. I've been averaging 47mpg on my traffic laden commute, and up to 55mpg on rides to places like Newcomb's Ranch. The smaller storage can be frustrating at times just to pack the stuff I need in it for work. I can barely fit my helmet in the trunk, but some may not be able to fit theirs inside depending on the brand and any Bluetooth or headset communication attachments. The 4 modes, Tour, Econ, Rain, and Sport, are again, amazing. I use Econ most of the time since I don't like to accelerate too fast. Tour is a great mode and has lots of power for every day riding. Sport mode on the other hand, all I can say is, "Hang on!" Rpms in Sport mode range around 3,500 - 4,000, and the bike will fly. It won't shift into 7th gear unless you're doing at least 65mph.

New this year is the walking mode. I really like that and use it a lot because I make a 3 point turn when I park in front my office window and it makes it so easy, I just love it.

I am just so amazed at this bike and love riding it, I couldn't have asked for a nicer riding bike if I tried, but then I like riding so much that over the years I go to as many demo rides as I can and have adopted a motto,

"Never pass up a free ride on a motorcycle".






