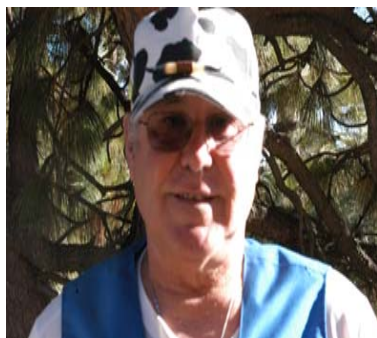

In the course of a ride, you might experience heat in one section and cold in another, so you must not only have the proper gear on board to cope with each situation, but also be aware of the potential risks of both hypothermia and dehydration.

Don't forget the rain gear. Staying dry on our motorcycles is not just about being comfortable; it's also about preventing hypothermia. Hypothermia is especially dangerous when riding a motorcycle, because symptoms can sneak up on you. A rider may not realize the affects of hypothermia until he makes a mistake. Even minor hypothermia can cause errors in judgment, a reduction in coordination, and slowed reaction times. "Layering up" is the best plan for riding during this time of year and offers the most options for adapting to the varying weather conditions that you might experience.

Road hazards are a concern any time of year, but in the fall you have leaves that can be wet and slippery. They can also fill in and camouflage pot holes.

Fog is also a concern in the fall, as well as shorter days, and more night riding. Not only will your visibility be reduced; but your visibility to others on the road will be less obvious, so wear bright clothing and reflective gear.

Understanding your motorcycle, your body, and your environment will greatly increase your chances of a great ride in any weather. Dressing for success is not only true in the job world, but for a more pleasant and safer ride, as well.

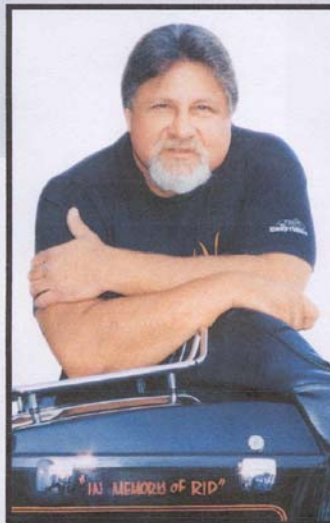

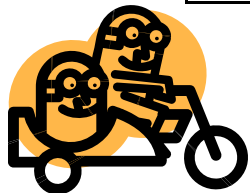
