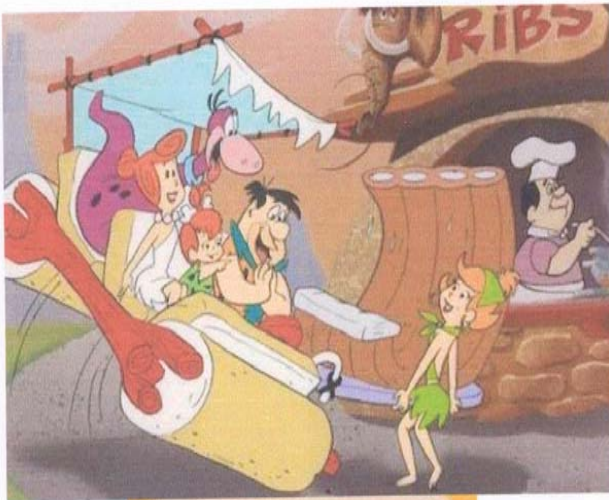
Happy New Year CA1M !!
