Trouble Can Be Just a Clique Away (Part 1 of 2)

One of the most empowering things about riding a motorcycle is the freedom to go wherever I please, by whatever route I please. I can choose to ride the twisting mountain roads, scraping my pegs all of the way or I can point my front tire towards the open highway, set the cruise control, and let hundreds of miles of scenery roll by before needing to stop for fuel. I can ride tank to tank or I can stop at every scenic outlook and historic marker. I might tow a trailer full of camping gear or choose to bed down at the local Best Western when my riding day is through or maybe do both if the ride is long enough. All said, motorcycling allows me to create a custom experience tailored to my preferences and my wishes. Motorcycling is an individualistic sport that allows me to make my own decisions, choose my own path, and requires me to take responsibility for my choices. Occasionally, I am blessed enough to encounter another rider whose preferences mirror my own and whose company I enjoy. On those occasions, the enjoyment of the ride becomes exponential as we band together in the brotherhood and sisterhood of those that have experienced the roads less travelled. It has been often said that, “people like people that are like themselves” and I suppose that adage is true for me as well. I tend to surround myself with people that measure their motorcycling success not in the number of trophies on their wall or accidents and near misses they have survived, but, rather, in the number of safe miles ridden and dangerous situations avoided. Our idea of a good investment is spending the time and money to take an advanced riding course to improve our skills rather than investing in louder tail pipes in hopes that someone might hear us approaching and move out of our way (by the way, if you genuinely believe that loud pipes save lives, please do me a favor and remount your exhaust to face forward so that those of us you have already passed, and are no longer a threat to you, don’t have to be subjected to your noise pollution). I tend to surround myself with people that believe that safety is a skill set that needs to be learned and continually practiced in order to be improved upon, but also understand that we will never be completely safe no matter how much we practice. I know that the best I can strive for is to manage the risks inherent in our sport which is why I own and wear safety gear; as I look around, amazingly, most of the people I ride with are also clad in like gear. I show up to motorcycling seminars only to find my friends in the audience or are actually the presenter and when I attend a motorcycle trade show it is like a class reunion of riding buddies.

My love of motorcycling is hardly unique and, based on the over 70,000 GWRRA members my love of touring on a Gold Wing is very much shared by others. My belief that knowledge is power is a recurring theme throughout our association and one of our core values, but it is not the most important of them; that would be friendship. Our motto is, “Friends for Fun, Safety, and Knowledge” and there is a reason the motto is worded in that order. If we examine the words individually, we can better understand why our organization exists:

Friends – Other people whom we like and genuinely care for and that we voluntarily want to spend time with

For – United in a common goal or desire

Fun - An enjoyable experience

Safety -Freedom from harm or danger

And – In addition to

Knowledge - Facts, information, and skills acquired by a person through experience or education; the theoretical or practical understanding of a subject

There you have it. Six little words that convey the essence of our organization and the reason we exist. Notice, that nowhere does it say anything about which make or model of motorcycle the member must ride or that owning or riding a motorcycle (much less a Gold Wing) is even a requirement. In order to meet the needs of our members, GWRRA operates chapters that are geographically convenient to facilitate the gathering of its members and to offer a framework for the safety and knowledge to be addressed. Being an organization rooted in motorcycling, the majority of the Chapters' activities are based around riding our bikes. All of the officers and staff are volunteers and rather than getting paid for their service, they usually end up coming out of pocket in order to provide an enjoyable experience for their friends. Most of the chapters have individuals that have invested time and expense to become certified Road Captains, Seminar Presenters, Parking Lot Practice Facilitators, First Aid and CPR Instructors as well as volunteering their time and expertise in such roles as Treasurer, Store Keeper, Ride Coordinator, Rally Coordinator, and Newsletter Editor (just to name a few). Because our members are so passionate about our sport, they often become very invested in their Chapter. Many times this dedication and devotion to our Chapter leads to the mistaken belief that certain members' opinions and views are more important than others' or that our Chapters are organized as some sort of democracy where the majority rules and nothing could be further from the truth.

The truth is that the District Director appoints the Chapter Directors based on whomever the District Director believes is best suited to lead the Chapter. Imagine the discontent that would reign amongst the Chapters if we held elections and your candidate didn't win. There would be a rift between Chapter members that might never be repaired. Also, most elections would denigrate into a popularity contest rather than the most qualified person ending up in the role they are best suited for. Either way, the chapter would probably end up as a collection of disjointed cliques with each clique doing their own thing.

So what is the cure? Simple: get involved and participate. Volunteering to be part of the solution is the fastest way to turn a chapter around. Going on chapter rides, showing up to business meetings, and attending chapter gatherings, in other words, making the fun happen, is the fastest way to turn a chapter into an exciting chapter. So, if you are always riding with the same people – stop! If you are sitting with the same people at every meeting and gathering – stop! And if you running with the same clique – well, you know what to do.

THE GOLD BOOK

Have you looked at it?

Have you really looked at what is in the Gold Book? Take the time to leaf through it. It is loaded with valuable information. In the front there are 2 GWRRA membership applications. Then you have a “Transfer of Membership” for the time you sell your Goldwing and do not wish to remain a member. GWRRA contact phone numbers. Rescue Plus phone numbers.

There is a “How to Use the Gold Book” section. It has explanations of what those letters are by the member names.

A-Truck or trailer available to transport crippled Goldwing

B-Will accept phone calls.

C-Tent space available

D-Sheltered sleeping space or lodging available

E-Tools available

F-Tour Guide for local area

GWRRA members that wished to be listed in the Gold Book have some of these letters by their names. If you find yourself in an unfamiliar place in the world, you probably can locate a GWRRA member in that area. We used it in Northern California when we needed the closest Honda service center and it worked like a charm. Honda Dealerships are also listed with their address and phone numbers.

There is a section on what and how to pack for a trip, both personal and for the bike. A list of motorcycle laws by state.

Recommended tire inflation pressures by all of the Goldwing tire manufacturers. Common (and not so common) hand signals to use if you don't have a CB or it is out. The proper way to tie down a Goldwing. (which I strongly suggest that you learn and do yourself instead of letting a tow truck driver do it for you).

They even included step-by-step instructions on the “Boyd Lift” . This is the proper and easy way to lift an Goldwing that has been laid over. It is not as difficult as it looks.

There is also a section on what to do in case of an accident.

All in all, there is a wealth of information that at some time might come in handy for you or someone in your group. When we get our new Gold Book, I take the old one and put it in our car, truck or RV. You never know when you will be somewhere with nothing to do and decide to visit a local GWRRA Chapter and meet and make some new friends!

North end of the Wal-Mart shopping center on Mt. Vernon and Washington off the 215 freeway Colton



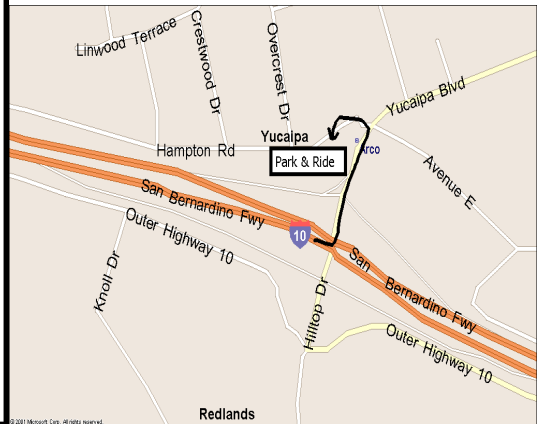

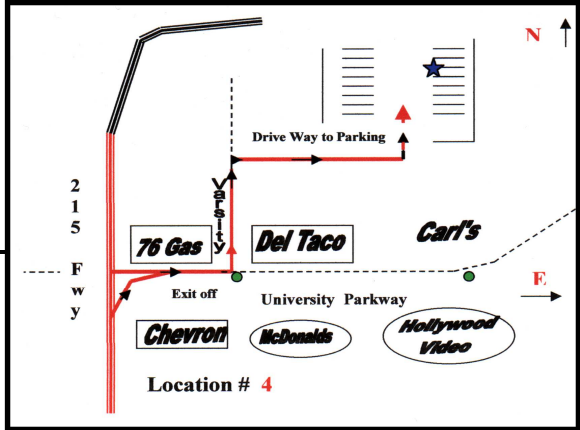
