Bakersfield or Bust



This is the article that I have rewritten for the last three months in a row. As many of you already know, we backed out of our Visalia contract when the Marriott refused to honor our contract rate for more than our minimum of 75 rooms. If we had kept our District Rally (yes, I said rally—but more about that later) at the Marriott in Visalia, the first 75 people to make a reservation would have received the \$94/night rate and everyone else would have paid their rack rate of \$119/night. We don't know if the Marriott booked another large group that weekend or if the economy has improved enough that the hotel just felt that they could get away with it; either way, Pam and I could not support a two-tiered price structure.

With no alternative hotel in mind, we started looking for another site to host our event. Hotels that meet our needs in terms of geography as well as having the facilities to conduct all of our classes and have enough rooms to accommodate all of us are a small number to begin with. After you subtract the hotels that really don't want motorcyclists (many hotels still view all of us as undesirable bikers), and our options shrink even further. We reached out a second time to our friends in Mammoth, but the best they could do for Labor Day Weekend was (before taxes) \$129/night. By this time Pam and I were starting to get a little worried. We have to work one to two years out in order to secure everything we need and now we were under six months. Originally, the DoubleTree Hotel in Bakersfield declined to put in a bid for this year's event because their meeting rooms were scheduled to undergo remodeling during the month of September. On a whim and partly out of desperation, we called the DoubleTree and explained our situation. They still had their renovations scheduled to begin September 1st, but because of our long standing relationship with the hotel, they agreed to postpone their remodel until the following week just to accommodate us

They also agreed to match the hotel rate we had at the Marriott even though their going rate for that weekend is \$189/night. While I am sure that Pam and I would have eventually found another venue for our event, we are not sure that it would have been as nice as what we have! The hotel is now accepting our reservations and will honor the \$94 rate for three days before our event as well as three days after.

Earlier, I referred to our convention as a rally. At some point in time, it became politically incorrect to call our events a rally for fear that the Infernal Revenue Service would audit us and that we would not meet the educational threshold for exemption (evidently conventions are for education and rallies are for fun). Our motto is "Friends for Fun, Safety and Knowledge" and while education is paramount to our organization and one of the core values Pam and I hold dearest, there is a reason that "Fun" is listed first. Our event will still have the full slate of classes that we have always offered, but, as always, the fun will be there as well.

Speaking of upcoming events, the Region Rally in Tucson is coming up over Memorial Day weekend and we have received a couple of questions regarding what the \$30 daily credit is all about. The answer is simple: for every room-night you spend there, you get a credit of \$30 to apply towards anything at the resort other than paying for your room. In other words, if you are eating at the resort, charge it to the room and \$30 of it is free. Buying a souvenir at the gift shop? Charge it to the room and use your credit for that as well. Not going to be able to use your credit one day because your chapter is going out on a ride? No worries, your credits roll over so you won't lose them. Here is a money saving tip I got from one of the locals: their lunch sandwiches are so large that even Goldwing riders could split one and not go away hungry. If you haven't yet registered for the event, go on to the Region webpage and do so as this year's rally is going to be awesome!

RIDER ED 'GIMME 5'

TOPIC: End of Season Cycle Maintenance

Whether the riding season in your area lasts only four or five months, or as long as ten months, most of us will let our motorcycles remain unridden for a long enough period of time that it is best to prepare it for a season of rest.

November typically brings weather throughout the northern tier of states that is not very good for motorcycling. Most parts of this great country of ours experience two or more months of weather that is not considered part of the riding season. The air temperature alone gets cold enough to cause hypothermia without adding the wind chill from sitting atop a motorcycle while blasting down the road at legal speeds – even at 45 mph. And many areas will have snow on the ground before the month is out. Some of you may be cold-blooded enough to prolong the season a few extra weeks, but for most, there is a period each year when your motorcycle becomes a lonesome friend sitting quietly in the garage from bad weather or just too busy.

Before you park it for a season of inactivity or start riding it again, this is a great time to get your end of season maintenance done. It is recommended that you change the oil and oil filter to remove contaminants – dirt, deposits, acids and moisture – that can lead to corrosion inside the engine. Other fluid levels should be checked for proper level. If the fluids are due for replacement based on miles ridden since the last change (check your manual and service history), this is a good time to do that and any other maintenance tasks that you may have been putting off. Start keeping a log of all of your maintenance with dates and mileage that it was performed. Your mechanic likely is not very busy at this time of year. He (she) would probably appreciate your visit, too! And you know your bike will be better for it. Then when spring comes next year (it is not that far off, after all!), you'll be ready to go without a visit to the mechanic before planning your next big ride. After you get it back from your mechanic, fill the gas tank and add the appropriate amount of fuel stabilizer (such as Stabil) before parking your Wing. Wash and wax the bike and inflate the tires. The battery should be disconnected from the motorcycle (negative terminal first) and trickle charged at least every 30 days, per your Gold Wing Owner's Manual. (Refer to your battery charger manual for more charging details.) Take good care of your Wing, and your Wing will take good care of you!

Those of us that don't have to "Winterize" our bikes sometimes do go for a prolonged period in the winter of not riding. Some of these tips can still apply to us as well. Don't forget to inspect your brakes and tires for wear and correct pressures. And look for screws, nails or cracks on your tires. Another good thing to check for is a blister or bubble on your rear tire. Put the bike on the center stand, start the engine, put it in gear, let out the clutch and then go behind the bike and look at the rear tire. While it rotates, if you see a wobble in the tread, it's probably a blister/bubble in the tire. If you see this, you need to replace the tire before the blister/bubble bursts.






