
Larry Tegal is working on getting some training seminars set up as we want our members to be the safest riders they can be. Stay tuned for more information and be sure and sign up with him.



Each and every of you bring a special shine to this Chapter, your individuality and presence is what makes CA1M, so special!!!!!



# Winter is Finally Here???

3 weeks ago WE had snow on the ground! If you were away from home on your bike, you definitely got a surprise! Even before that we started getting snow and ice in the local mountains. The point is, you can't be too prepared. Even if the sun comes out and the clouds go away, there is still a lot of dangers lurking around the next corner. All of those pretty green trees make for shadows that stretch across the road. The sun coming out melts the snow and it runs across those shadowed corners that are still cold and creates BLACK ICE. Black ice is a rider's/driver's worst nightmare. And you can't see it until it's too late. Slow down and look before you roll on the throttle in those twisties that we all love. Unfortunately, we have to wait until the spring, summer and fall to ride most of our truly favorite mountain roads. Be very careful if you decide to go up in the mountains this time of year.

The other issue is that you have to carry your rain gear in your saddlebags all of the time. You never know when a rogue cloud burst will strike. They happen when you least expect them. It's also not a bad idea to at least carry a good half cover to keep the weather off of your instruments and your seat. And by all means, make sure that you have good tread on your tires. Bald tires spell disaster in wet weather.

A good set of heated clothing is also a good investment this time of year. It might be perfect riding weather with the sun out. But when it goes down, it gets cold quickly. At least carry another layer to put on and a good pair of winter riding gloves if not electrics.

It's going to be June and 100 degrees before we know it. But in the meantime, be prepared for the weather we have.

All articles submitted may be edited at the discretion of the Newsletter Editor, depending on the space available. Controversial subject matter may not be submitted.




