# **Tour Directors**

#### **On the Road Again**

I"m a truck driver I drive my truck all day thinking of ways to make my rides fun.



When you are leading a ride you need to first decided on the restaurant that you want to go to. hopefully one that is good. Second, you pick a location that is close to the restaurant and a route on how to get there. Utilizing at least an hour. When you get to the restaurant, I like to do something's that no one else does. like playing some table games while we are waiting for our dinner to be served. Think about all the arrangements you need to make, make some notes to yourself. Call the restaurant and let them know how many people you are bringing. Make sure the restaurant takes separate checks.

Don't forget about your tail gunner, he is in the most important position. He is responsible for keeping the group together. He keeps his eyes open for hazards, making sure the group is riding in a safe manner. He should be an experienced rider.

Who wants to lead the next ride???? Let me know.

Riding two up. I didn't think I would ever say this, but I am riding sometimes two up. And boy, it sure is different than riding by yourself. You need to get into a routine. I look at other experienced riders and think what teamwork. They are on the bike and ready to go. Get on the bike put your helmet on. Put your gloves on, put on your jacket, and make sure everything is plugged in. We're learning the routine and having fun doing it.

"How come you can't hear me"?

Your cords not plugged in".

If you have a place you want to ride, please let me know. Lets put some new rides together. All ideas welcome. If you know someone who has a motorcycle and wants to ride with us, give him or her my name and phone number. ! We have great weather coming up, **so lets get out and ride!!!!**

# Larry Tegel CA1M Chapter Educator



It's that time of the year to refresh our memories on some critical items. I'm referring to Riding in a Group. As GWRRA members, we generally ride in groups of 3-7 riders. There is a Lead or Road Captain, a Tail Gunner and of course the riders, all of which makes up the TEAM. We should always try to ride in accordance with the GWRRA way. That's what we are going to review.

## Road Captain

A leader capable of setting up a ride according to the GWRRA way.

A leader trained in how to lead a Team and trained in the duties of the Tail Gunner.

Road Captains should be the Chapter Director, Assistant Chapter Director, Rider Educator and Ride Coordinators.

Anyone wanting to further their knowledge in Team riding.

### Road Captain Responsibilities

Should be experienced.

Make safe decisions.

Picks the Tail Gunner.

Sets the speed for the ride.

Sets the tone for the ride.

Maintains communication and control.

Communicates lane changes, speed changes and road hazards.

## Tail Gunner Responsibilities

Controls the general conduct of the ride (he can observe the whole group from the back).

Ensures that the Team (riders) are abiding by the rules.

Drops off to offer assistance to a team member that has pulled over (preferably has First Aid kit and is First Aid/CPR certified).

Notices any unusual riding action.

Secures lanes for the team as requested by Lead.

Keeps Lead informed.

Controls the pace of the ride.

## Team Member (Riders) Responsibilities

Ride their own Ride (within their comfort zone).
Arrive prepared (appropriate attire for weather conditions), fuel topped off and ready to ride.
Communicate any change in position.
Maintains adequate spacing and position.
Follows the Lead bike directions.
Minimizes CB traffic.
Makes certain that they have the ride information.
Communicate any issues or concerns to the Lead bike.

#### Now, we can enjoy the Ride!

The preceding information were some excerpts out of the Road Captain Training Course. They represent the GWRRA Way of Team/Group riding. It can go without saying that we discuss several other aspects of Team riding and how to ride safe. If we can and should follow these guidelines, we can feel pretty prepared for a safe ride. It is GWRRA's feeling and mine that we enjoy our family and ride in a fun and safe way.

Rider Education has several courses designed to give you the knowledge to be safe and build your confidence in riding. The Road Captain Course can be taught any time and can provide the inexperienced rider the information to gain that experience to feel confident to ride in a Group/Team.

Ken Crow, Nevada District Educator, wrote the above article for his District Newsletter. Anyone who would like to learn how to be a Road Captain and or Tail Gunner, or just want to understand why we do things the way we do, come to the class. It will help you understand things even if you never want to Lead or Tail Gun.




